

Seniors and their Parents/Guardians: Want information about Maine's Community Colleges? Check out their website. Many majors - related to careers in many industries (mechanical, technical, medical, business, and many more!) are available in ONE AND TWO year programs. Did you know that financial aid is available at all Maine Community Colleges, and that the average cost for one year at a Maine Community College for students who attend classes and live on campus can be as low as \$10,000 a year (varies by campus)? And if a student did not live on campus, for one year the average cost would be around \$5,000. A Maine Community College education can be an economical way to train for one's future career!
