A Note from the School Nurse:

Just an fyi for all parents, and those taking their children to the doctor in the upcoming months:

There will be new state mandated vaccine requirements going into effect this coming 2018-19 school year. The state legislature has "provisionally adopted" a rule change for Chapter 126/261 (LD 1664) Immunization Requirements for School Children. A letter from the Maine CDC will be forthcoming when the rule passes the Senate and the House:

Quadrivalent meningococcal conjugate vaccine (MCV4): Effective for the start of school year 2018, one dose of MCV4 is required for children entering 7th grade. Any child entering 12th grade is required to receive two doses of MCV4. The first dose shall have been received on or after the 11th birthday, and the second dose shall have been received on or after the 16th birthday, at least eight weeks after the first dose. If the first dose is administered when the child is 16 years of age or older, only one dose is required.

In addition, all incoming grade 7 students must have the Tdap (Tetanus, Diphtheria, Pertussis) booster shot.

Please ask your doctor to give you an updated immunization record to send to Nancy Sobanik, RN, Massabesic High School nurse, along with a physical and clearance (if required for sports or other activities). All grade 12 students will be required to provide documentation of immunization with the MCV4 vaccine. Thank you!

NJROTC



Massabesic High School's NJROTC unit conducted their Annual Inspection on March 29, 2018. The inspection is an annual requirement with a formal report sent to the Naval Service Training Command, Pensacola, FL with a copy to the Superintendent of RSU#57. The inspection looks at all areas of the Unit to include school support, administration of the program, academic program, reports and records, cadet performance, and student mentorship. During the visit the cadets form up for a uniform inspection with awards for outstanding personal appearance, perform a formal parade and drill demonstration, present supply and admin programs, and brief the inspecting officer on the state of the program. Members in the NJROTC unit at Massabesic have been practicing and preparing for this moment all year, to make sure every shoe was shined, movement mastered, and knowledge of the maritime heritage of the Navy learned, all for inspection day. NJROTC curriculum emphasizes citizenship and leadership development among its cadets, through the teachings of structured courses and extracurricular activities, all done to teach our future leaders of the community. The curriculum lived up to its purpose at the inspection when cadets were able to demonstrate the core values of Honor, Courage and Commitment. The ceremonial phase was open to the public and was well attended by staff, administrators, parents and school board members. The inspecting official this year was CDR Craig Baranowski from Falmouth, Maine.



Twenty-nine (29) students from Massabesic's Naval Junior Officer Training Corps attended a Leadership Challenge Weekend during the first weekend of Spring 2018. While most families in the RSU#57 area are enjoying the annual event of Maple Sunday, NJROTC cadets were involved in physical fitness, team

building and leadership activities in Castine, Maine. The cadets participated in a number of events including, hands on Engineering Experience, Marine Biology Lab, Survival Suit Swim, Physical Fitness session with an active duty Marine Corps Drill Instructor, Ship Bridge Simulator (driving a ship), and much much more. There were more than 170 cadets from 8 programs throughout the state of Maine and New Hampshire.

The purpose of Leadership Challenge Weekend is to emphasize all the attributes of the NJROTC program outside of the school environment. Building confidence, enhance leadership skills and to develop a sense of responsibility and independence. The training was not all work, the cadets put their team building skills together at a Leadership Challenge Olympics where cadets competed against other platoons in many different physical fitness activities. This included tug of war, dodgeball, capture the flag, relay races, etc... The cadets also enjoyed sleeping onboard the TS State of Maine, Maine Maritime Academy's training ship, a unique experience. Their meals were provided by Maine Maritime Academy's dining facility, rated one of the best in the nation for college/university quizes. Every meal offered multiple entree's, fresh fruit, fresh salad bar, and an over abundance of deserts to entice anyone's pallet.

Even though the course was only three days in length, these cadets walked away with more than just leadership experience. They walked away with lasting friendships and the true knowledge of what it takes to be a leader.
