Technical Education

The students in the small engines class are in the process of reassembling their engines. Their ability to use a repair manual provides them with information needed to reassemble their engines correctly. They have learned to use ring compressors, valve spring compressors, feeler gauges and other specialized tools in the process. The last phase of the course will be to use what they learned in class to troubleshoot and diagnose the assembled engines if they won't run.
